Clerical Taxation Returns for the Pre-Reformation Diocese of Exeter Part 4: the Forced Loan of 1522

## Introduction<sup>1</sup>

Exeter Cathedral Archives D&C.2953 is a newly-identified return listing the contributions that the clergy of Devon and Cornwall made to Cardinal Wolsey's forced loan of 1522. Returns also exist for the sees of Canterbury and London.<sup>2</sup> This note prints the body of the Exeter return showing the contributors, their annual worth and the amounts that they lent to the crown.<sup>3</sup>

## Background

Wolsey's forced loan introduced new assessments of income and property for the laity and clergy.<sup>4</sup> The cardinal was aware that the assessments used in parliamentary taxation were outdated and unable to generate the revenues that the crown needed so in early 1522 he sent commissioners into the counties to obtain sworn statements of personal wealth under the pretext of establishing the male population's ability to contribute to the defence of the realm either by personal service or by the provision of arms and armour. The reports arising from this subterfuge prompted Wolsey to impose a forced loan on the realm which eventually brought in over £250,000, an exceptionally large sum for the time.<sup>5</sup> Despite assurances, none of the money was ever repaid.

## The manuscript

Wolsey wrote to Bishop Veysey of Exeter on 30 August ordering him to compile a return listing the names, wealth and contributions of those of his clergy who held ecclesiastical livings worth at least £10 a year or who had a combined annual income of 20 marks and above from livings and personal goods.<sup>6</sup> Veysey completed his task on 31 December.<sup>7</sup>

The return is a parchment roll comprising 11 membranes sewn from head to tail.<sup>8</sup> The membranes are approximately 26 cms wide and vary in length from 32 to 62 cms. Overall the document is 5.5 metres long and is in good condition with no

problems of legibility except for some endorsements on the initial membrane which have been obscured by rubbing, dirt and damp. This membrane has also been trimmed because Veysey's address to Wolsey which begins the return lacks its opening lines.

The roll spent its early life away from the south-west as Wolsey required the records of the loan and the military-cum-fiscal surveys to be sent to the Star Chamber which was his power-base. Over time many of these documents were either destroyed or dispersed. Veysey's roll was probably sent back to Exeter in the seventeenth century and it was doubtless then that it found its way into the capitular archives. 10

## Editorial practice and analysis

I have kept the tabular format of the original. Column 1 names the rural deaneries in which the contributors resided. The archdeaconries to which the deaneries belonged are shown in brackets. Column 1 also records the totals contributed to the loan for each deanery. In the original these stop at Trigg Major deanery but I have continued them for the remaining deaneries and groupings of clergy.

Column 2 identifies the contributors to the loan and their preferments. With the exception of the cathedral dignitaries at the end of the return, the scribe does not give the forenames of the secular clergy. Nor does he name the heads of religious houses. I have used episcopal registers and other sources to remedy these omissions.<sup>11</sup> Dashes show where I have been unable to establish a name or where the evidence is conjectural.

Not every cleric in Devon and Cornwall who contributed to the loan appears in the return. These were pluralists who resided in other dioceses and who answered for their incomes there. Veysey estimated that approximately 100 benefices were affected in this way.<sup>12</sup> The names of some of the absentees can be recovered from the military-cum-fiscal surveys that have survived for the city of Exeter and five of the nine hundreds of Cornwall.<sup>13</sup> They are listed in an appendix along with those

clerics who appear in the surveys but who were deemed too poor to contribute to the forced loan.

Columns 3 and 4 give the annual worth of the contributors' personal goods and spiritual preferments. I have used the footnotes to make a comparison between the sworn declarations of clerical wealth obtained by Veysey's officers and those taken earlier by the crown's commissioners which are recorded in the military surveys. We know that Wolsey was unhappy with the initial attempts of the commissioners to obtain details of personal wealth and that orders were issued in July 1522 to repeat the exercise. This may explain why Veysey was put to the trouble of swearing his clergy and why there are discrepancies between the sums declared in the surveys and the return.

Column 5 records the amounts contributed or to be contributed to the loan. In all £5140 4s 5½d was to be lent by the clergy of the south-west which equates to £2.7 million in today's money. Most was to come from the cathedral dignitaries and heads of religious houses who received letters from the crown setting out the amounts that they were expected to contribute. Meanwhile rank and file clergy were to contribute at the rates of 25% or 10% of their declared incomes. The higher rate was paid by those holding benefices worth £10 or more. Personal goods were ignored in calculating their contributions. In contrast the 10% paid by those holding poorer livings was levied on the combined worth of personal goods and spiritual preferments. This meant that the effective rate of tax of the higher rate payers was often no more than that of the lower rate payers.

Richard Banham, the abbot of Tavistock, was charged with the task of collecting the loan in Exeter diocese.<sup>19</sup> His efforts brought in £2164 4s 7½ d which was paid to Edmund Peckham treasurer of the king's chamber.<sup>20</sup> It is unclear whether this sum included the contributions due from the cathedral dignitaries and heads of religious

houses. Certainly some individuals chose to deal directly with Peckham probably because they lacked the funds to pay Banham and his agents.<sup>21</sup>

Less than 500 individuals are named in Veysey's return at a time when the clerical workforce of the diocese probably numbered in excess of 1500.<sup>22</sup> Nonetheless the forced loan marks the beginning of a period of burdensome taxation for the clergy of the south-west and beyond. In 1523 Convocation granted a subsidy of one half of the annual value of clerical incomes using the assessments of the previous year thereby abandoning the *Taxatio* of Pope Nicholas IV of 1291 which had formed the basis of clerical taxation throughout the later middle ages.<sup>23</sup> A decade later, Thomas Cromwell, who was Wolsey's lieutenant in 1522, formalised this break with the past by making the tenth paid on clerical incomes into an annual tax, by extending the payment of first fruits - the first year's income of a benefice - to all clergy admitted to livings and by using the *Valor Ecclesiasticus* - a revaluation of spiritual property - to calculate the tenths and first fruits.<sup>24</sup>

A sign of the hard times ahead was the refusal of clergy in Devon and Cornwall to pay all or part of the subsidy of 1531. Over the next few years some 170 clerics were pronounced obstinate excommunicates by Veysey and reported to the secular authorities for arrest and detention until they conformed.<sup>25</sup>
