

A Calendar of the Register of Richard Redmayne, Bishop of Exeter, 1495-1501

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Introduction¹

A full introduction will be added at a later date. A few brief remarks about Redmayne's appointment and his register now follow.

Redmayne was translated from the diocese of St Asaph by papal provision on 8 November 1495 two days after his predecessor King was provided to Bath & Wells.² This was another of the episcopal merry-go-rounds that Henry VII liked to indulge in. Redmayne received the temporalities of his new see on 7 January 1496, the day after King was granted the temporalities of Bath & Wells.³

Unusually among the bishops of Exeter Redmayne was a monastic.⁴ He was the youngest son of a prominent Westmorland family. Nothing is known of his upbringing or education. It is unlikely that he attended university. By 1457 he had become abbot of Shap⁵ and two years later was appointed visitor-general of the Premonstratensian order in the British Isles. In 1471 he was consecrated bishop of St Asaph, probably as a result of his family's ties with Richard duke of Gloucester.

After Richard's usurpation, Redmayne became more prominent in public affairs. He was present at the new king's coronation and was probably active in supporting his kinsman Edward Redmayne as sheriff of Somerset and Dorset. He was also involved in diplomatic work.

Redmayne was not summoned to the first parliament of Henry VII's reign and was not pardoned until February 1486. But two years later he was again employed in government work and in 1489 he became a royal councillor. In 1494 he was present when Prince Henry was made duke of York. Translation to the more prosperous see of Exeter may have been a reward for his loyalty to the new regime.

Despite his responsibilities elsewhere – he remained abbot of Shap and visitor-general until his death in 1505 – Redmayne was active in his role as bishop of Exeter. He instituted and ordained whilst he also conducted visitations.⁶

In 1501 Redmayne was again translated, this time to the wealthy and important see of Ely. His ties with Richard Fox, now bishop of Durham, may have led to this move.⁷ There was, however, a sting in the tail. Redmayne's successor at Exeter, John Arundell, brought a dilapidations suit against him for allowing the episcopal manors to fall into disrepair. A roll detailing the 'decays' has survived and is transcribed in the Appendix below.

Redmayne's register comprises 43 parchment folios. Today it is part of the volume of late fifteenth century episcopal registers known as Chanter 12 part 2.⁸ But until at least the middle of the seventeenth century it stood alone. An inventory of 1641 describes it as 'a book written in parchment containing 23 leaves with some loose things in it'.⁹ The first 23 folios comprise the institutions sub-register. They and the remainder of the register were probably foliated in the later sixteenth century.

It is especially noticeable that Redmayne's register does not begin until two years after the commencement of his episcopate even though we know that he was active in his diocese in 1496.¹⁰ This is another example of the lax approach to the recording of episcopal *acta* at Exeter in the later fifteenth century.¹¹ Perhaps the rough notes of the institutions and other necessary acts of Redmayne's early years were lost amongst the records of his visitations of the Premonstratensian houses.

Appendix

John Arundell's dilapidations suit against Richard Redmayne¹²

Here appeareth the decays of the lordships and manors of the bishopric of Exeter in the county of Devonshire as they were left at the translation of the right reverend father in God Richard Redmayne now bishop of Ely and the sums of money wherewith the said manors and lordships would be re-edified, amended and sufficiently repaired as divers masons carpenters, tilers, daubers¹³ and other artificers sworn and examined and upon the same have

shown and deposed by their oath before John More gen¹⁴, Master Richard Sydnor¹⁵ and John Orenge gen¹⁶ and in the presence of many others.

Crediton

The manor place there was left and is in such case that masons, carpenters, tilers, daubers and other artificers which have seen it will not enterprise to make and repair it sufficiently for the bishop of Exeter to lie therein under 220 marks.

Item the reparation of the tenancies in the town there and of the park pale¹⁷ and hedges of the park will cost £40.

Chudleigh Manor

Divers artificers before rehearsed which have seen the said manor will not enterprise to make it sufficiently for the bishop of Exeter to lie therein under 200 marks.

Item the said bishop of Ely before his translation destroyed a fair slaughter house belonging to the said manor and sold away the timber and stone of the said house to the great hurt of the said manor.

Bishop's Clyst

The manor of Clyst was left in such case by the said bishop of Ely at the time of his translation that artificers before rehearsed will not enterprise to make it sufficiently for the bishop of Exeter to live therein under £50.

Item the tenancies within the said manor of the said bishop's [have] been in such decay that they will not be sufficiently repaired under 40 marks.

Item the profit of the warren of the coneys¹⁸ there was in the said late bishop's time and long time before let to farm for £8 by the year and a little before his said translation the said warren was by his servants destroyed so that it will be [a] long time [before] there will be had any profit thereof.

Palace Exeter

The reparation of the leads there and other decays of the same palace as artificers which have it seen have deposed will cost £110.

Bishop's Tawton

Divers artificers before rehearsed which have seen the said manor will not enterprise to make it sufficiently for the bishop of Exeter to lie therefore under £600.

Item there was a wood sale there made by the said bishop and the said wood not closed nor coppiced again so that it is now utterly destroyed.

Paignton

Divers artificers before rehearsed which have seen the said manor will not enterprise to make it sufficiently for the bishop of Exeter to lie therein under £70.

Radway and Bishopsteignton

At Radway was a fair place for the bishop of Exeter to lie in and at [Bishops]teignton was a fair farm place which [have] been both utterly destroyed and been fallen down in the said bishop's time and would have been saved at his entry with little cost which as now artificers before rehearsed will not enterprise to re-edify under 600 marks.

Ashburton Manor

The manor place there was left and is in such case that it is almost destroyed in such wise that it will not be re-edified and sufficiently made as artificers before rehearsed have said and deposed under 400 marks.

Bishop's Nympton

At Nympton was sometime a fair place for the bishop of Exeter to lie in which is now all down and destroyed in such wise as artificers before rehearsed will not enterprise to make it sufficiently under 600 marks.

Peterhayes

At Peterhayes was a fair place for the bishop of Exeter [to] lie in which was utterly destroyed by the said late bishop and the timber and stones of the said place sold away by the said late bishop and his officers and great sums of money taken therefore in such wise as it is now no place.

Richard Tomlynson²¹ is presented by the king on the death of Philip Longens.²²

1. 8 Oct²³ 1497: Pillaton Rectory²⁴
John Nans UID vicar-general²⁵ receives a certificate of the inquisition held into the vacancy from William Pers BCnL official of the archdeacon of Cornwall²⁶ which also recites Nans' commission of 9 Oct in which John Hervy BA is recorded as having been presented by Sir Richard Pudsey and Edward Waldegrave. The inquisition was held in Menheniot church on 6 Nov and the following clergy from East deanery attended: John Antonius rector of Calstock²⁷, John Knollys rector of St Dominick²⁸, Walter Tretheny rector of St Ive²⁹, Edward Mayow rector of Rame³⁰, M William Baron vicar of Menheniot³¹, Thomas Radon vicar of Antony³², John Ady vicar of Quethiock³³ and Nicholas Tremeder vicar of Maker.³⁴ They report that Pillaton fell vacant by the resignation of M Thomas Cobbys on 22 Jul 1497. Sir William Say last presented. Pudsey and Waldegrave are patrons for this turn. There is no litigation about the benefice, nor any pensions, portions or taxes due. Hervy is free, legitimate, suitable, in priest's orders and aged 26 and more. He has no other livings. There are no objections to the presentation or Hervy.

John Hervy BA³⁷ is instituted by Nans³⁸ on the resignation of M Thomas Cobbys.³⁹ He is presented by Sir Richard Pudsey and Edward Waldegrave.

3. 16 Oct 1497: Gwennap Vicarage

M James Trevethen priest⁴⁰ is instituted by Nans on the resignation of M John Nans.⁴¹ He is presented by the Exeter Dean & Chapter.

William Chepman⁴² is instituted by Nans on the resignation of William Torre.⁴³ He is presented by the Exeter Dean & Chapter.

6. 3 Jan 1498: Okehampton Vicarage

M John Fulford⁴⁶ is instituted by Nans on the resignation of M John Nans.⁴⁷ He is presented by Tavistock Abbey.

7. 27 Jan 1498: Overhey Prebend Chulmleigh

John Pampynge lit⁴⁸ (proxy John Scoos⁴⁹) is instituted by Nans on the death of Henry Abyndon.⁵⁰ He is presented by Edward Courtenay earl of Devon.

Thomas Colman chaplain⁵¹ is collated by Redmayne at Chudleigh manor on the resignation of William Raw.⁵² The mandate to induct is sent to M John Pawell BCnL vicar of Padstow and official of Redmayne's peculiar jurisdiction in Cornwall.⁵³

The inquisition was held in Barnstaple church on 15 Mar and the following clergy from Shirwell deanery attended: M David Cauntun UIB rector of Charles⁷¹, M Thomas Nicholl rector of Loxhore⁷², John Bolyn rector of Shirwell⁷³, Simon Grow rector of West Buckland⁷⁴, James Godyng rector of East Buckland⁷⁵, Thomas Lucas rector of East Down⁷⁶, William Smyth rector of Stoke Rivers⁷⁷, Nicholas Harper rector of Heanton Punchardon⁷⁸, John Davy vicar of Ashford⁷⁹, John Cockys vicar of Barnstaple⁸⁰, M John Chapelayne chaplain⁸¹ and John Hurlevrensch chaplain.⁸² They report that Bratton Fleming fell vacant by the death of M Richard Begg on 7 Mar 1498 and who was buried on 9 Mar. He has one other living.⁸⁴ There are no objections to the presentation or presentee.

Bound in between folio 23 and the start of Redmayne's inquisitions register on folio 24 are two papers belonging to a cause in the Exeter consistory court brought by Nicholas Treryse rector of Lapford⁴⁷⁹ against John Drake one of his parishioners for the non-payment of mortuaries. The first is the court's definitive sentence absolving Drake and awarding him costs. The second is a torn bifolio containing the depositions of John Wescott rector of Eggesford⁴⁸⁰, William Hardmed vicar of Coleridge⁴⁸¹, John Mathew at Symon of Lapford and Mathew Kyllond of Lapford, the last two having served as farmers of Treryse's benefice. They testified before the president of the consistory, Robert Cook UIB⁴⁸², on 20 Nov 1506, setting out the custom for levying mortuaries in Lapford and neighbouring parishes.⁴⁸³
