Clerical Taxation Returns for the Pre-Reformation Diocese of Exeter Part 2: the 1489 Charitable Subsidy

## Introduction<sup>1</sup>

During the 150 years preceding the Reformation various attempts were made to increase the yield of clerical taxation in England. The standard tax, the tenth which was levied on the annual worth of benefices, used valuations that were over a 100 years old and which had been eroded by inflation. Richard II and the Lancastrians employed poll taxes to overcome the problem whilst Cardinal Wolsey tried a combined income and property tax.<sup>2</sup> In between, the Yorkists and the first Tudor king reintroduced the charitable subsidy.

## Background

Charitable subsidies first appeared in England at the start of the fourteenth century.<sup>3</sup> Raised by bishops for their own use they were paid by clergy who contributed to the tenth. After a gap of 80 years when no charitable subsidies were imposed the tax reappeared under Edward IV as a levy granted by Convocation and targeted at those elements of the clerical workforce that did not contribute to tenths: the unbeneficed and clerks who held poorly endowed livings.

At least nine charitable subsidies were approved in the last four decades of the fifteenth century.<sup>4</sup> They coincided with grants of tenths and were increasingly seen as a makeweight underwriting the anticipated yield of the tenths which were now awarded in multiples. Thus in January 1489 Convocation voted Henry VII two tenths – a 'great subsidy' as shocked clergy called it - for his forthcoming war with France.<sup>5</sup> It was hoped that the tenths would each produce £12500 but as a safety measure Archbishop Morton was awarded two minor or charitable subsidies on the understanding that once the target of £25000 had been reached no more would be collected.<sup>6</sup>

The first of the subsidies fell due on 1 May.<sup>7</sup> In March Morton sent instructions to the bishops of Canterbury province telling them what groups of clergy were liable for the subsidy and the rates at which they had to pay. The bishops were to appoint collectors who would also record the names of the clergy who were being taxed. This paperwork and the money gathered were to be sent to the archbishop in

London unlike the returns for the tenths which went straight to the royal exchequer.8

## The manuscript

No original assessments have survived for the 1489 subsidies, but a *Liber* Taxationis containing contemporaneous fair copy returns from 10 dioceses exists at Lambeth Palace Library. <sup>9</sup> It comprises 90 paper folios in 12 quires bound into a limp vellum cover measuring 305mm by 225mm. The manuscript is in excellent condition and there is a modern foliation. 10

Most of the copying has been done by one scribe; a second has produced the assessment for the diocese of London which ends the volume. Each return has been allocated a new quire. This explains the varying sizes of the quires and the large number of stubs from the blank folios that the scribes discarded when they finished their copying. 11 Although the manuscript is undated, internal evidence confirms that its contents belong to April or May 1489.12

The Liber has lost its first folio. 13 Otherwise it is complete although the material it contains is not. Several archdeaconries are missing from the copied returns<sup>14</sup> whilst eight dioceses from Canterbury province have not been included at all. 15 Why this is so is unclear unless the *Liber* is meant to be a record of what was actually collected by the bishops' agents. Certainly we know that Morton cancelled the

second charitable subsidy due for payment on 1 November presumably because the target of £25000 had been reached.<sup>16</sup>

The return for the diocese of Exeter has the most detail about the clergy who contributed, their salaries and the tax they paid. Unfortunately the return is one of those that is incomplete: only the assessments for the archdeaconries of Exeter, Totnes and Barnstaple – effectively the county of Devon – have been copied. The archdeaconry of Cornwall's return which would have been produced by a different team of collectors is absent.

## **Editorial Practice and Analysis**

I have kept the tabular format of the original. Column 1 lists the names, preferments and parishes of the contributing clergy by deanery within each archdeaconry. According to Morton's instructions the subsidies were payable by stipendiary chaplains (including mendicants), chantrists, chaplains in receipt of pensions or portions and certain beneficed clergy. In the *Liber* the main divisions are between the stipendiaries and the beneficed.

Columns 2 and 3 give the salaries and contributions of the clergy. The rates of tax are:<sup>20</sup>

- 3s 4d (for stipendiaries and mendicants receiving 40s with food and drink, 21 pensioners receiving 40s and chantrists receiving 4 marks)
- 6s 8d (for stipendiaries and mendicants receiving 7 marks or 4 marks with food and drink; pensioners and chantrists receiving 7 marks; chaplains holding benefices valued between 10 and 12 marks who had been excused from contributing to the tenths by their diocesans and whose names had been notified to the collectors)
- 10s (for stipendiaries, mendicants and chantrists receiving 10 marks)
- 13s 4d (for stipendiaries and mendicants receiving 12 marks and pensioners receiving 10 marks)
- 16s 8d (for stipendiaries and mendicants receiving £10)
- 20s (for pensioners receiving £10 and chantrists receiving 12 marks)

The following were exempted from the subsidy:<sup>22</sup>

- vicars choral and chaplains of cathedral and collegiate churches bound to personal residence
- poor chaplains studying at Oxbridge and monks residing in cloisters
- sick or aged chaplains unable to serve and who had been certified by their ordinaries

Five hundred and fifty three clerics are named in the assessment below.<sup>23</sup> Most were local men with an average age of 50.<sup>24</sup> Two-thirds were unbeneficed.<sup>25</sup> Graduates or university attendees formed well over a tenth of the assessed; they were almost entirely Oxford men.<sup>26</sup> Forty-five clerics did not contribute to the subsidy: 17 refused and were suspended, excommunicated or sequestrated<sup>27</sup> whilst 28 were exempted because of age, ill-health or poverty.<sup>28</sup>

The subsidy produced £175.<sup>29</sup> This compares with the £60 raised in 1463 when 162 stipendiaries were taxed.<sup>30</sup> Considerably more clerics were assessed in 1489 than in 1463 but the average amount they paid fell from 7s 5d to 6s 7d. Although charitable subsidies would not have been popular with the clergy they enabled bishops to shelter their more vulnerable colleagues from the full impact of rising taxation and to spread the burden of fiscal responsibility more broadly and equitably.<sup>31</sup> This was the lull before the storm of Henry VIII's reign when royal profligacy forced a fundamental overhaul of clerical taxation to the lasting detriment of the church, its hierarchy and its workforce.
