Clerical Taxation Returns for the Pre-Reformation Diocese of Exeter Part 6: the 1540 Clerical Subsidy

Introduction¹

This is the last in my series of pre-Reformation taxation returns for the clergy of Exeter diocese. It is exclusively devoted to the curates, chantrists and chaplains who served in the parishes of the south-west and who were collectively known as stipendiaries because they were paid wages for their work. Bishop Veysey's return gives us an opportunity to view them as a group before many of their employments were abolished by the Chantries Acts of 1545 and 1547.

Background

Convocation granted the king a subsidy in the spring of 1540.² It was the first since the passage of the act of first fruits and tenths in 1534 which imposed higher and more frequent levels of taxation on the clergy. It was also the first since the deeply unpopular great subsidy of 1531, parts of which were still outstanding in 1538.³

The subsidy was to be collected over two years. Both beneficed and unbeneficed clerics were taxed. The former were to pay 10% of their income each year⁴ whilst the latter were charged an annual rate of 6s 8d. Bishops and their agents were responsible for collecting the subsidy. The due date for payment was Christmas and receipts were to be sent to the court of first fruits and tenths by 1 April following.

Bishops were required to certify the names and wages of their unbeneficed clergy to the Exchequer by 2 February in each of the two years. Our return is Veysey's first certificate for Exeter diocese.⁵

The manuscript

The return is a parchment book measuring 300mm by 130mm which has 22 unnumbered folios including the covers.⁶ 'Exon' is written on its front. It is in good condition and legible. Very likely it is a contemporaneous copy of Veysey's certificate made by the scribes of the first fruits and tenths office.

The return occupies 19 folios and begins with a short address from Veysey to the barons of the Exchequer confirming that he has carried out parliament's orders. The stipendiaries are listed by parish, deanery and archdeaconry. Details of their employers are given but not their wages. An addendum lists those beneficed clergy who were claiming exemption from the subsidy because they

had paid their first year's income (or first fruits) to the crown within the last 12 months.⁷

Frances Rose-Troup transcribed (sometimes erroneously) the Devon portion of Veysey's return in the early 1930s.⁸ She used it (and two other slightly later listings)⁹ to cast light on the fate of former monks following the dissolution of their monasteries. She did not mention, and perhaps did not realise, that the return was principally a record of clerical taxation.

Editorial practice and analysis

I have adapted the tabular format of the original. Column 1 contains my foliation of the return and totals of stipendiaries for each page of the return. Column 2 lists the parishes and chapelries served by the stipendiaries whilst columns 3 and 4 names the clerics and their employers. As on previous occasions, graduate clergy are shown in italics.

According to the return there were 672 stipendiaries in the diocese in 1540 each contributing 6s 8d to the subsidy. The total yield - £224 – equates to over £95000 in today's money.¹¹ The stipendiaries were distributed as follows:

These are almost certainly conservative figures. Only 386 parishes are mentioned in the return when the later medieval diocese had nearly 600 mother churches. It is difficult to believe that at least some of the omitted parishes did not need stipendiaries to help with the labour intensive ceremonies of catholicism.

The return is largely silent about the type of work the stipendiaries did. However, it is a reasonable assumption, borne out by evidence from earlier returns and elsewhere, that those employed by incumbents and impropriators

(farmers) were curates whilst those hired by parishioners, churchwardens and lay notables were chantrists or chaplains celebrating at a shrine or serving a religious fraternity.

At least 65 stipendiaries were former monks or friars¹⁴ who had been licensed to serve as parish clergy following the dissolution of their houses. They were welcome recruits helping to offset the decline in ordinands caused by the ending of monastic titles.¹⁵ At least 93 stipendiaries went on to become rectors and vicars.¹⁶ But the majority either remained as curates or were forced into early retirement by the Chantries Acts.
