

## Key Points<sup>1</sup>

- This spreadsheet lists the men from Devon and Cornwall and elsewhere who were ordained in the diocese of Exeter during the later medieval and early modern periods.
- The bishops' registers are the main source<sup>2</sup> but ordinations were also recorded in the registers of the archbishops of Canterbury when the see of Exeter was vacant or when a metropolitan visitation was being held.<sup>3</sup>
- Unfortunately the bishops' registers do not provide an unbroken record of ordinands. There are significant losses for the later medieval period. Almost a third of the years covered by the spreadsheet are affected. The losses are detailed in Table 1.
- I have created two versions of the spreadsheet. The first lists ordinands by surname, the second by date of ordination.<sup>4</sup>
- Over 43000 orders are recorded in the spreadsheet. Table 2 shows their distribution by year and grade whilst the line graph identifies trends over the period.<sup>5</sup>
- The vast majority of ordinands were seeking to become secular (or parish) clergy. In the pre-Reformation period 4057 orders were granted to regular clergy (or members of religious houses).
- Most men received more than one order. I have attempted to bring together the entries relating to these men whilst noting the variations in the spelling of surnames.
- Almost all ordinands came from the diocese of Exeter.<sup>6</sup> 2318 orders are recorded as having been conferred on men from other sees.<sup>7</sup> Almost half of these were granted to men from the neighbouring diocese of Bath & Wells.
- 1543 men are recorded as graduates in the registers. I have searched for them in Emden, Foster and Venn. Those that do not appear are marked with an asterisk.
- I have also searched in Emden for the men who received titles from Rewley Abbey, Osney Abbey and St Frideswide's Priory. These houses were close to

I have made random checks with the registers themselves to test the accuracy of the transcriptions. Only Hingeston-Randolph's edition of Stafford's register is problematic. This was the first of the Exeter registers that Hingeston-Randolph edited and the approach that he adopted – he produced an extended index rather than a calendar – led to errors which I have corrected.

This is because the scribes responsible for the ordination sub-registers did not begin to identify men from the diocese of Exeter until Bishop Lacy's episcopate (1419-55). Most of the blank entries are for ordinands from Devon and Cornwall.

Oxford and so it is likely that the men they granted titles to attended that university. 253 ordinands are involved. Again those not found are marked with an asterisk in the degree column.

- Twenty-six men who are designated alumni of Oxbridge in the post-Reformation period are listed in the Notes column. Nine do not appear in Foster or Venn and are marked with asterisks.
- Table 3 lists the principal grantors of titles.<sup>8</sup> Over 18800 titles are recorded in the spreadsheet and monasteries supplied almost three-quarters of them.
- The dissolution of the monasteries ended the large-scale granting of titles bringing ordinations at Exeter to a temporary halt in the 1540s as candidates for major orders struggled to find alternative forms of title.<sup>9</sup>
- When ordinations resumed in the second half of the sixteenth century titles were no longer routinely recorded in the registers. There was now a shortage of clergy which enabled the newly ordained to obtain employment quickly as curates<sup>10</sup> or incumbents. There was no longer a pool of unemployed or partially employed clerics for the authorities to worry about.

1258-91	Other than for a handful of individuals, Bishops Bronescombe and Quinils' registers do not contain the names of ordinands. <sup>12</sup>
1291-1307	Bishop Bitton's entire register is missing. <sup>13</sup>
1322-26	Bishop Stapeldon's ordinations sub-register ends in 1321. <sup>14</sup>
1327-69	Bishop Grandisson's ordinations sub-register is missing. <sup>15</sup>
1393-94	Bishop Brantingham's ordinations sub-register ends in 1392. <sup>16</sup>

<sup>10</sup> I have taken the phrase 'about to serve' which appears occasionally in the ordination lists for Bishop Cotton's episcopate (1598-1621) to mean 'about to become curate of....'

<sup>11</sup> Either the fair-copy record of ordinations has disappeared or the scribes failed to copy the ordinations into the bishops' registers.

<sup>12</sup> It was not yet the practice to devote a separate section to ordinations in the bishops' registers (*Bronescombe 1*, pp. 215, 365).

<sup>13</sup> It is not mentioned in the 1641 inventory of episcopal muniments (Inventory, p. ). Perhaps it disappeared at the time of Bishop Stapeldon's murder (see next note).

<sup>14</sup> Stapeldon, a close associate of Edward II, was murdered by the London mob in 1326. His register (and that of Bronescombe which Stapeldon had with him at the time of his death) fell into the hands of the mob (*Reg Bronescombe 1*, p. vii). Possibly the final folios of the ordinations register were removed or damaged at this time. The 1641 inventory mentions the sub-register but does not indicate how many folios it contained.

<sup>15</sup> There are references to it in the common registers of Grandisson and Brantingham (*Reg Grandisson*, p. 820; *Reg Brantingham*, p. 275). It had disappeared by the time of the 1641 inventory.

<sup>16</sup> The scribes failed to copy the remaining ordinations into the sub-register (*Reg Brantingham*, p. 877).
