

**A Calendar of the Register of John Arundell,
Bishop of Exeter, 1502-04 including the *Sede
Vacante* Register for 1501-02**

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Introduction¹

A full introduction will be added at a later date. A few brief remarks about Arundell's appointment and his register now follow.

Redmayne was provided to Ely by Pope Alexander VI on 26 May 1501 but he remained personally active at Exeter until the early summer.² In July Archbishop Henry Deane appointed Hugh Oldham and Richard More to act as his commissaries during the vacancy of the see and in the autumn they mounted a visitation of the diocese.³ A partial record of this survives which is calendared below.⁴ The *sede vacante* period came to an end on 29 June 1502 by which time Arundell had taken charge of his diocese.

The new bishop was a native of Cornwall. His father was Sir Remfrey Arundell, the head of a junior branch of the Arundell family of Lanherne.⁵ John was probably born in the later 1430s and attended Oxford University where he studied theology. His ecclesiastical career began in 1459 and gathered momentum under the Yorkists. He was successively treasurer and chancellor of Hereford Cathedral and held prebends at Wells and York Cathedrals and St George's Chapel Windsor.⁶ In 1482 he was elected dean of Exeter following Lionel Woodville's promotion to the see of Salisbury.⁷ An acolyte of Peter Courtenay then bishop of Exeter, Arundell was involved in the duke of Buckingham's rebellion against Richard III in the following year. Whilst Courtenay fled abroad and was attainted for treason, Arundell made his peace with the king and received a royal pardon.⁸ Evidently his involvement was of a lesser scale than that of his episcopal superior.

Arundell was cautiously introduced into public life by Henry VII being appointed a commissioner for Calais in 1485, an envoy to Burgundy in 1488 and chancellor to Prince Arthur by 1493. Three years later in August 1496, when he was probably nearing 60, he was rewarded with the bishopric of Coventry & Lichfield, a large see situated in the heartlands of the kingdom. Arundell was a successful diocesan at Coventry. He appointed capable men to positions of authority within his administration – Oldham and John Veysey especially - whom he then brought to the south-west when he was translated to Exeter on 8 April 1502. The temporalities of his new see were formally granted to him on 5 July⁹ and he began his register on 17 July.

Arundell's rule at Exeter was disappointingly short. His death in London on 15 March 1504 obliges us to suspend judgement on his episcopate.¹⁰ His register, a mere 14 folios, is a rather tawdry affair. Much is made of Arundell's appointment of John Sixtinus, a Netherlander and friend of Erasmus, as his registrar.¹¹ But this seems to have added to the problems because Sixtinus had no practical knowledge of church government and had to rely on the help of his predecessor, John Scoos¹², who cannot have been happy to have been displaced by an inexperienced foreigner. The runt of the pack, the register book was initially kept separately in the bishop's registry until it was united with the other late fifteenth century registers to form what is now the second part of Chanter 12.¹³

The bodies of Talland and his family may be buried in the aisle free of charge. Talland has been in dispute with other parishioners about this and had earlier made his claim before Arundell's vicar-general, John Veysey.

110. This is a Latin prologue and eulogy by John Sixtinus³⁵⁷ who has been appointed registrar by Arundell. He praises the bishop for reflecting honour on his ancient and illustrious pedigree through his learning and virtues.³⁵⁸ Every day Arundell's household assemble together in the palace chapel where services are conducted with vocal and instrumental music. The bishop maintains hospitality and makes a daily distribution of alms at the gate of his palace. Arundell readily rewards merit among his chaplains. Sixtinus also explains the circumstances of his appointment as registrar. The recent practice of combining the registrarships of the bishop's audience and consistory courts has proved unsuccessful.³⁵⁹ There is too much work for one man to do and standards have fallen to the detriment of the bishop's subjects. Arundell has therefore asked Sixtinus to take over the audience court registrarship.³⁶⁰
